Role of climate change in extreme events

- Question is not 'why did this event occur' (answer: weather) but 'how much more or less likely was this event due to...climate change'
 - The most intense tropical cyclones are getting stronger, with more rainfall, higher seas flood more
 - Fires become more frequent in a warmer world (all else being equal)
 - Record temperatures breach physiological thresholds (flving foxes deaths due to climate





Carbon stock in the atmosphere


